

Total GDP \$trillion (2015)





FIGURE 2a – For use with Question 1



do you agree or disagree that people in Cardiff To what extent feel safe?





Number of violent crimes per 1000 people, 2016–2017




FIGURE 4 – For use with Question 2



The change in life expectancy along the number 83 bus route in Sheffield, a city in the UK. The index of multiple deprivation is also shown on the map.







Country income group





FIGURE 7b – For use with Question 4 The global distribution of the concentration of PM_{2.5} atmospheric pollution in 2016

FIGURE 8a – For use with Question 4 The number of refugees received by selected European countries from 1 January to 30 June 2015




FIGURE 8b – For use with Question 4 The rise of anti-immigration parties in selected European countries between 2013 and 2018

Voting intention (% of respondents)




FIGURE 8c – For use with Question 4 Placards used at a 'Refugees welcome here' march in London held in 2016




