Almost 90% of African-Americans lived in the South in 1890. Throughout the country, African-Americans were victims of poverty, discrimination, violence and ignorance. Within America, they were a despised minority, believed by almost all whites to be inferior in every way and deserving of their fate. Violence against African-Americans was commonplace; the worst year being 1892 when 292 people were lynched. High wages in the North led to half a million African-Americans leaving the South between 1914 and 1919. The North responded with fear and anger. Segregation and oppression were commonplace. In 1917 riots broke out in 26 cities and, by the end of the decade, African-Americans were seen as invaders of white neighbourhoods.
