Adapted from a letter about the situation in the Balkans sent by the Emperor of Austria to the German Kaiser, Wilhelm II, September 1908.

**Dear Wilhelm,
Bosnia has wanted independence from Turkey for some time. Now that Turkey is weak, Austria should take control of Bosnia and rule it.**

SOURCE C

A cartoon commenting on the situation in the Balkans published in November 1908 in a German magazine. The magazine often criticised the Kaiser's policies.

In the cartoon, Austria-Hungary steals small 'birds' from an unstable building. The stolen birds are labelled, "Bosnia" and "Herzegovina". A large bird labelled, "Serbia" is pecking at Austria-Hungary. Two birds labelled "Bulgaria" and "Turkey" are fighting each other. Germany and Italy are holding the ladder while Britain, France and Russia look on.
