SOURCE A

A cartoon published in an American newspaper in 1971 commenting on meetings between the USSR and the USA.

In the cartoon, two men are sitting at a table talking to each other. On the table, there is a card that says, “Salt Talks”. Each man is sitting on top of an unstable stack of bombs. The man on the right represents the USA; his stack of bombs is resting on a man who is labelled, “US Tax Payer”. The man on the left represents the USSR. His stack of bombs is resting on a man labelled, “Soviet Tax Payer”.

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SOURCE B

A cartoon published in Britain in May 1960 commenting on the U2 Crisis.

The figures represent France, the USA, Britain and the USSR. The bird represents peace.
