

SOURCE A

A poster drawn by Emily Ford in 1908.

Ford was an artist who also designed pamphlets, banners and postcards supporting women's suffrage. She was an active member of the Leeds Suffrage Society and a friend of the Suffragist, Millicent Fawcett.

The poster, on the opposite page, shows a woman looking at a poster on a door that says, "FACTORY ACTS REGULATIONS FOR WOMEN". The woman is wearing a red shawl, and has her hand on her hip. The caption reads, "THEY HAVE A CHEEK I'VE NEVER BEEN ASKED".
