From a speech to the Women's Republican Club of Wheeling, West Virginia, by Joseph McCarthy, Senator for Wisconsin, 9 February 1950.

The reason we find ourselves powerless is not because the enemy has sent men to invade our shores, but rather because of the traitorous actions of those who have had all the benefits of the wealthiest nation on earth – the finest homes. 5 college educations and government jobs that we can give. This gives you a picture of the type of individuals who have been helping to shape our foreign policy. In my opinion the State Department is thoroughly infested with communists. I have in 10 my hand 57 cases of individuals who would appear to be either card-carrying members, or certainly loyal to the Communist Party, but who nevertheless are still helping to shape our foreign policy.
