


### FIGURE 1 – For use with Question 1


# Effects of climate change UN climate scientists warn of specific risks this century




### **GNI = Gross National Income**








### FIGURE 6 - For use with Question 1



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

Biomass store (tonnes carbon/hectare)


Trunk 120 Branches 80 Leaves 10 Roots 30







