

SHELTER

Shelter is a charity for housing and homelessness. There is a huge increase in people seeking Shelter's services. Shelter uses the social media platform TikTok to educate and inform people about the ongoing housing emergency. TikTok has over one billion users. Many TikTok users are aged between 16 and 25.


The charity has created short educational videos. These videos are shared on TikTok and other social media platforms. Shelter posts educational content that raises awareness for issues such as overcrowding and tenants' rights.



Shelter uses the platform to:

- create educational videos about the housing crisis in the UK
- highlight fundraising campaigns and petitions
- break down myths around eviction rules
- explain what hidden homelessness is
- give practical tips such as how to help someone who is sleeping rough
- inform homeless people how to access free sanitary products.







